Maryland College Application Week October 25-29, 2021

What is the Maryland College Application Week?

- The goal of the MCAC Week is to help high school seniors navigate the college application process and increase the number of seniors completing at least one college application.
- MCAC is a national effort to increase the number of first generation & low-income students pursuing a college degree or other higher education credential.
- To give high school seniors step by step help with completing applications.
 - Senior English teachers will teach students how to write a college essay.
- Content Area Teachers will be available to write college recommendations for students.
- The campaign will take place during the school day and the CCA and Grade level Counselors will be available to assist students with applying for college online.

University of Maryland College Park Incentive Awards Program

The University of Maryland College Park Incentive Award Program is designed for exceptional students who demonstrate academic ability, uncommon persistence, and maturity despite very difficult circumstances. Through full scholarships and wraparound services, Baltimore City, Charles County, Montgomery County and Prince George's County high school students with significant financial need can attend and thrive at the University of Maryland.

More than a prestigious scholarship, at the heart of the Incentive Awards Program is the development of individual character and community responsibility within an intimate network of staff, peers, advisors and mentors. Students must apply by November 1 deadline to be

Is the ACT/SAT Required for the Class of 2022?

As you may know by now, many schools have become “test-optional” or “test blind” for the Class of 2022 admissions. Test-optional policies mean that you are not required to submit a test score, but, if you do, admissions officers will look at them and may use the score to help determine admission. On the other hand, a “test blind” school will not look at any standardized test scores at all. To learn more about this, read the post on “test optional” vs. “test blind” policies. Please follow up with the schools you are interested in attending. Note that some scholarships still require ACT/SAT scores, so make sure to do the research.

College Board Opportunity Scholarships

There are multiple ways to earn scholarships up to \$40,000. <https://opportunity.collegeboard.org> This unique opportunity guides students through the college planning process and offers them a chance to earn money for college for each action they complete. Students in the CLASS of 2022 are eligible regardless of income, citizenship status, GPA, or test scores. The scholarship doesn't require an essay or an application. Scholarships range from \$500 to \$40,000 and can be used for two- or four-year institutions. Half of all scholarships will be awarded to students whose families earn less than \$60,000 per year.

GI Transferability Bill

Post 9/11 GI Bill family transfer option allows service members to shift their benefits to their families. For more information, see [Post-9/11 GI Bill | Veterans Affairs \(va.gov\)](https://www.va.gov/post-9-11-gi-bill/). U.S. Senate approved a new benefit for student veterans and their families. The proposal would require public universities that want to continue receiving GI Bill benefits to offer recent veterans in-state tuition. Veterans' spouses and dependents are also being eligible for the benefit.

Medical Condition Scholarships

Scholarships that are offered for students with specific medical conditions or some for students who have a parent or a family member with a specific diagnosis. Most can be used at any school. Some cover one specific condition, while others cover whole types of diagnoses (such as all types of cancers) or even all chronic diseases.

How to Search for Scholarships: The scholarships are sorted several ways:

- **By Medical Condition/Diagnosis** (specific conditions such as brain cancer or general categories like cancer)
- **By Non-Medical Condition** (social, emotional, psychological or educational issues and disabilities. This includes such categories as bereavement, bullying victims, family issues and children whose family has or is in the Armed Forces).
- **By All Conditions**
- **By Residency of Applicant**
- **By Scholarship Name**
