Financial Aid and the FAFSA

Completing the FAFSA is the key to being considered for most types of aid.

The sooner you complete the FAFSA, the better opportunity you will have to receive money to help pay for college. It cannot be said enough . . . the most important thing you can do is complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). Regardless of whether you think you will qualify for federal, need-based grants or not, you should still complete the FAFSA. Many schools will not even issue any institutional merit-based scholarships if the FAFSA is not completed and submitted. You will also need to complete the FAFSA if you need any student or parent loans.

REMEMBER – FINANCIAL AID CAN RUN OUT!!! COMPLETE YOUR FAFSA NOW!!!

ALL SENIORS who are planning on attending college after they graduate need to create an FSA ID and complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). Maryland Boy's State Program- (For Junior Boys)

American Legion Boys State is among the most respected and selective educational programs of government instruction for high school students. It is a participatory program where each participant becomes a part of the operation of his local, county and state government. Boys State has been a program of The American Legion since 1935 when it organized to counter the Fascist inspired Young Pioneer Camps. The program was the idea of two Illinois Legionnaires, Hayes Kennedy and Harold Card, who organized the first Boys State at the Illinois State Fairgrounds in Springfield. Activities include legislative sessions, court proceedings, law enforcement presentations, assemblies, bands, chorus, and recreational programs. High school juniors are selected by local American Legion posts to attend the program. In most cases, expenses associated with attending this program are paid by a sponsoring American Legion post, a local business, or another community-based organization.

GI Transferability Bill Post 9/11 GI Bill family transfer option allows service members to shift their benefits to their families. For more information, see Post-9/11 GI Bill | Veterans
Affairs (va.gov). U.S. Senate approved a new benefit for student veterans and their families. The proposal would require public universities that want to continue receiving GI Bill benefits to offer recent veterans in-state tuition. Veterans' spouses and dependents are also being eligible for the benefit.

<u>Medical Condition Scholarships</u> Scholarships that are offered for students with specific medical conditions or some for students who have a parent or a family member with a specific diagnosis. Most can be used at any school. Some cover one specific condition, while others cover whole types of diagnoses (such as all types of cancers) or even all chronic diseases.

How to Search for Scholarships: The scholarships are sorted several ways:

- **By Medical Condition/Diagnosis** (specific conditions such as brain cancer or general categories like cancer)
- **By Non-Medical Condition** (social, emotional, psychological, or educational issues and disabilities. This includes such categories as bereavement, bullying victims, family issues and children whose family has or is in the Armed Forces).
- By All Conditions
- By Residency of Applicant
- By Scholarship Name
